

INFORMATION BULLETIN

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) PROGRAM

The College Board Advanced Placement (AP) Program consists of 32 college-level courses and exams in 19 disciplines for highly motivated students in secondary schools. Its exceptional reputation is made possible by the close cooperation of secondary schools, colleges and the Program, high school faculty find that AP courses greatly enhance students' confidence and academic interest, and college faculty find that these students are far better prepared for serious academic work.

AP courses are offered in more than 11,700 high schools in every state in the United States, every province and territory in Canada and 63 other countries. They are recognized by nearly 2,900 universities throughout the world which grant credit, advanced placement or both, to students who have performed satisfactorily on AP Exams. Approximately 1,400 institutions will grant sophomore standing to students who have demonstrated their competence in three or more of these exams.

The AP Program provides course descriptions and teaching materials as well as exams based on those descriptions. It does not, however, dictate the textbook, schedule of lessons or teaching techniques. Students' exam grades are sent to the colleges of their choice, which then grant credit, advanced placement or both, depending on institutional policies.

AP exams are offered throughout the world each May. They are administered at participating schools or multi-school centers.
