## Who is Eligible?

People living in poverty.

Some exceptions for seniors, Veterans and people living with HIV/AIDS.

Some exceptions for people that need help with foreclosure, domestic violence or crime victims' compensation.

**We are required to ask about immigration status.**

Clients must be US citizens, lawful permanent residents or refugees/asylees.

Exceptions for victims of domestic violence or victims of a crime.

People with an adjustment of status application might be eligible.

Citizen children are eligible regardless of parents' status.
