Requirements:

- 1. Students must have taken all of the CTE courses below and have at least a "C" or better in each course.
- 2. Students must meet any additional general education pre-requisites for the articulated course.
- 3. Student must attach a copy of the student's official transcript to the Articulation Agreement Credit Award Form and submit it to the CCC admissions representative.
- 4. The agreement pertains to CPS students that successfully complete their CTE program by July 2023.
- 5. The agreement is valid for 2 years following the student's graduation date.
