About City Colleges

City Colleges gives students access to a quality education and ensures their success by providing them with the support to complete their program and move on to further education or a career.

City Colleges of Chicago (CCC) aims to ensure the success of every student and serve as an economic engine for the City of Chicago.

City Colleges of Chicago is the largest community college system in Illinois and one of the largest in the nation, with 5,500 faculty and staff serving more than 80,000 students annually at seven colleges and six satellite sites.

With locations across the city, the seven colleges include: Richard J. Daley College, Kennedy-King College, Malcolm X College, Olive-Harvey College, Harry S Truman College, Harold Washington College and Wilbur Wright College. City Colleges also oversees: the award-winning Washburne Culinary Institute, the French Pastry School, the Parrot Cage Restaurant at South Shore Cultural Center, the Sikia Banquet Facility, five Child Development Centers, the Center for Online Learning, the Workforce Academy, the public broadcast station WYCC TV Channel 20 and radio station WKKC FM 89.3.

For the past seven years, there has been a collaborative effort to review and revise CCC programs and practices to ensure students leave college-ready, career-ready and prepared to pursue their life's goals.

Since 2010, City Colleges has more than doubled its graduation rate and number of degrees awarded, and seen increases in transfer, adult education transitions, remedial transitions and more. In that same time, City Colleges has saved \$70 million, undertaken a \$545 million capital plan, and posted balanced budgets with no increase in property taxes.

Under the guidance of Chancellor Juan Salgado, City Colleges is seeking leadership to continue the last seven years of success.



Serving a Diverse Student Body

TRANSFER

In FY2015, 49% of City Colleges students had transferred to a bachelor's degree program within two years of completing City Colleges. Most students go to an Illinois-based college or university, with the following colleges being among those matriculating the most CCC students:

More than 100 years of quality, affordable post-secondary education

City Colleges of Chicago first opened its doors on September 11, 1911 as Crane Junior College. Nicknamed “the people’s college,” it was established under the Chicago Board of Education as a way to provide high quality, affordable education accessible to all in Chicago. There were just 30 students in the first class.

By 1929, Crane Junior College, with 4,000 students, was the largest junior college in the country. But, the college was forced to close in 1933 during the Great Depression. There was an immediate public outcry, led by students, faculty, members of Chicago’s growing labor movement, and most notably, attorney Clarence Darrow. The college reopened less than a year later as Herzl Junior College. Two new sites were added: Wright Junior College on the Northwest Side, and Wilson Junior College on the South Side.

During World War II, the colleges were taken over by the military for use as training facilities. After the war, soldiers returning to school on the GI Bill filled City Colleges to capacity.

In the 1950s, Truman College opened as an evening college at Amundsen High School. Fenger College and Southeast College also opened consolidating to create Olive-Harvey College two decades later.

Expansion continued in the 1950s, with the opening of Bogan Junior College on the Southwest Side (later renamed Daley College) and Loop College Downtown (later renamed Harold Washington College). In 1968, students closed down several City College campuses amid civil rights issues. To recognize the key civil rights leaders, Herzl College was renamed Malcolm X College and Wilson College became Kennedy-King College.

WYCC TV began televised instruction in the 1980s through the Center for Online Learning and Olive-Harvey College’s South Chicago Learning Center opened.

Satellite sites continued to grow as well. Humboldt Park Vocational Education Center and Arturo Velasquez West Side Technical Institute opened in the 1990s under Wright and Daley Colleges respectively and Dawson Technical Institute became part of Kennedy-King College.

In 2007, a brand new Kennedy-King College opened at 63rd and Halsted Street which houses WYCC TV, Washburne Culinary Institute, and WKKC Radio.

As City Colleges approached its 100th anniversary, Chancellor Hyman launched the Reinvention initiative in 2010. The centerpiece of the Reinvention effort is to ensure student success, drive greater degree attainment, job placement and career advancement and become the economic engine for the city of Chicago. The initiative is a long-term, ongoing effort designed to ensure CCC continues to benefit Chicago into its second century.

In order to prepare Chicagoans for careers in growing industries, City Colleges launched the College to Careers initiative in 2011. The initiative partners City Colleges faculty and staff with employers and universities in fast-growing industry sectors to help align City Colleges curricula and facilities so students are prepared with skills to succeed in the workforce. These partnerships also provide City Colleges’ students access to real-world experience via teacher-practitioners, internships and first-pass at job opportunities.

To help eliminate the barrier of cost and allow students across Chicago to achieve the dream of attending college, the Chicago Star Scholarship was introduced in 2014. It guarantees completion-ready students with a 3.0 GPA at Chicago Public Schools, starting with 2015 graduates, a free education for up to three years at City Colleges of Chicago, after the application of financial aid. The Chicago Star Scholarship has helped more than 3,000 Chicago students go to college for free. Following the introduction of the Star Scholarship, City Colleges entered into partnership agreements with 20 four-year colleges and universities across Chicago to offer further financial incentives to students planning to transfer after completing at CCC.

As part of its ongoing capital plan, City Colleges has made strategic investments that align with its strategies, including a new Malcolm X College campus, a \$45 million TDL Center at Olive-Harvey College, and a modernization plan for Richard J. Daley College that will include a state-of-the-art Engineering and Advanced Manufacturing Center.



Focused on Student Success

City Colleges is focused on ensuring students have access to a quality, affordable post-secondary education and find success, meaning they complete their program in a timely fashion and move on to further college and careers.

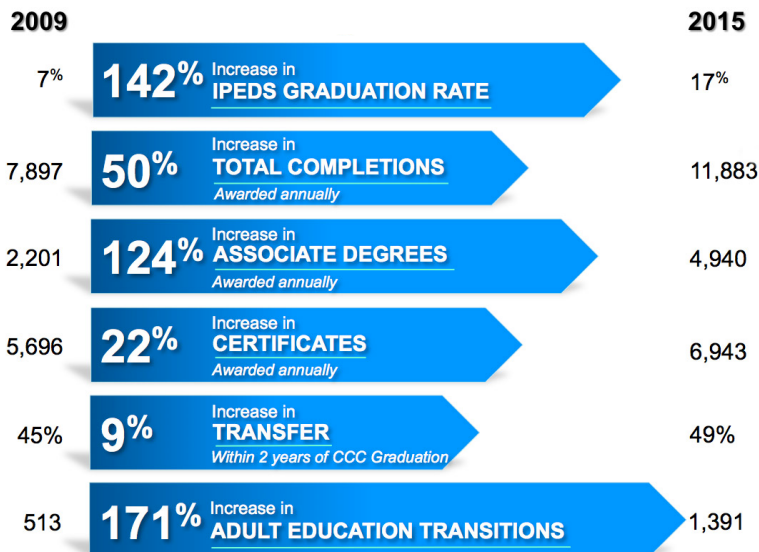
CCC's four goals:

- To increase the number of students earning college credentials of economic value
- To increase the rate of transfer to bachelor's degree programs following CCC graduation
- To dramatically improve outcomes for students requiring remediation
- To increase the number and share of adult basic education/ GED/ESL students who advance to and succeed in college-level courses.

City Colleges has involved more than 200 students, faculty, staff and external partners, working on task forces to identify its most pressing challenges and design and implement solutions.

City Colleges defined four primary strategies: to increase the relevance of CCC programs and better align them with workforce demand, to provide students with greater structure so they are less likely to fall off track, to increase student supports, and to improve the efficiency of operations. Stemming from these strategies, City Colleges developed a five-year plan (2013-18), which outlines quantifiable metrics associated with these strategies.

Since 2010, City Colleges has seen:



Increased Completion

- The number of degrees granted annually has jumped from an average of 2,000 to over 5,000, the highest amount in City Colleges' history.
- In that same time, the official IPEDS graduation rate has more than doubled (from 7 to 17 percent).
- At the same time, City Colleges has seen a more than doubling of the number of adult education students transitioning into college credit courses and a double digit increase in the percent of remedial students transitioning to credit courses.

Increased Relevance—College to Careers

- In December 2011, Mayor Emanuel and City Colleges launched College to Careers under which each college has become the center for excellence in the fields with the strongest expected jobs growth over the next decade:
 - Healthcare at Malcolm X College (*84,000 in healthcare over coming decade*)
 - Transportation, Distribution, and Logistics at Olive-Harvey College (*110,000 jobs*)
 - Culinary Arts and Hospitality at Kennedy-King College (*44,000 jobs*)
 - Business and Professional Services at Harold Washington College (*300,000 jobs*)
 - Information Technology at Wilbur Wright College (*44,000 jobs*)
 - Advanced Manufacturing at Richard J. Daley College (*14,000 jobs*)
 - Education, Human & Natural Sciences at Harry S Truman College (*39,000 jobs*)
- To support the College to Careers effort, CCC opened a new \$251 million Malcolm X College and School of Health Sciences in January 2016 that includes a virtual hospital, and will complete a \$45 million Transportation, Distribution, and Logistics Center at Olive-Harvey College along with an Engineering and Advanced Manufacturing Center for Daley College.
- CCC faculty and 150 corporate partners are rewriting curriculum to ensure relevance to the marketplace, and partners also are providing teacher practitioners along with internship and job interviews to qualified students.
- New College to Careers programs of study and courses are added every semester.
- To date, College to Careers has yielded more than 3,000 placements.

Increased relevance—transfer to four-years

- CCC has worked equally hard to ensure CCC degrees hold economic value by aligning with requirements at four-year universities, so that students transferring can do so with junior standing.
- Due to recent reforms, transfers after CCC completion have increased 9 percent.
- CCC has entered into specific articulation agreements with more than 25 universities, and is a member of the Illinois Articulation Initiative, a statewide transfer agreement that standardized general education foundation course packages and counts 50 four-year universities.
- Very strong articulation agreements are in place, for example, with DePaul, IIT and UIC where students who take certain courses and achieve certain outcomes are guaranteed a slot at the four-year university and may even receive scholarships, up to a full ride in the case of IIT.
- The Chicago Star Scholarship, created with savings from City Colleges' capital plan, served its first cohort of qualified Chicago Public School graduates in Fall 2015, providing more than 3,000 students with free community college tuition, books, after the application of financial aid, for up to three years. To qualify, recent CPS graduates need a B average, to test completion-ready, and to sign up for one of City Colleges' College to Careers pathways. Twenty (20) four-year college partners have signed on to provide Star Scholars with additional support to complete their bachelor's degrees.



Increased student supports

- City Colleges has developed career centers, transfer centers, wellness centers for social/emotional support, veterans centers, and math emporiums at every college.
- City Colleges has cut the student to advisor ratio from 920:1 in 2010 to 275 students: 1 advisor today.
- Faculty and advisors also have access to GradesFirst, an early alert tool.

Increased operational efficiency

- City Colleges has saved \$70 million through increased efficiencies and a reduction in redundancies that has been reinvested in the classroom.
- City Colleges has posted balanced budgets, with no increase in property taxes.

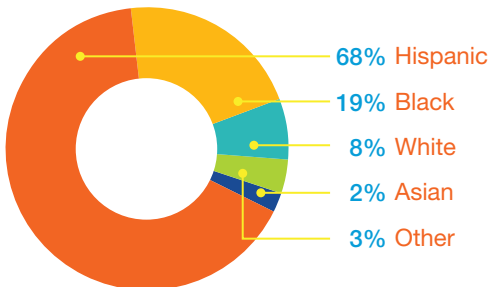

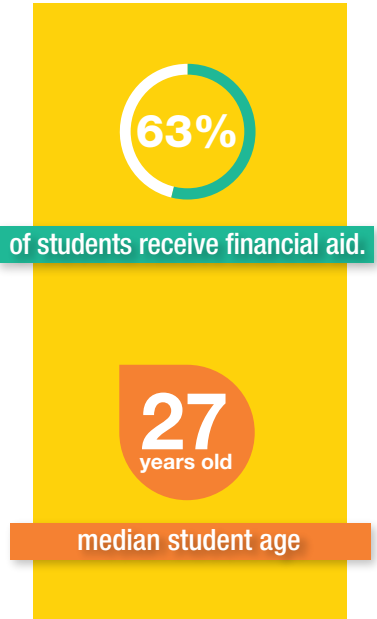

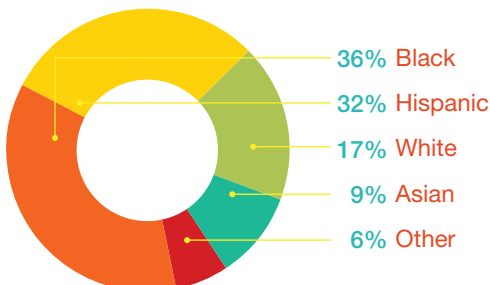

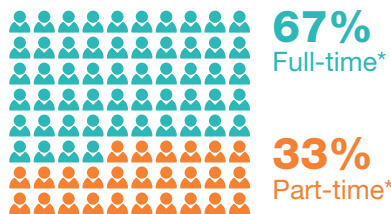

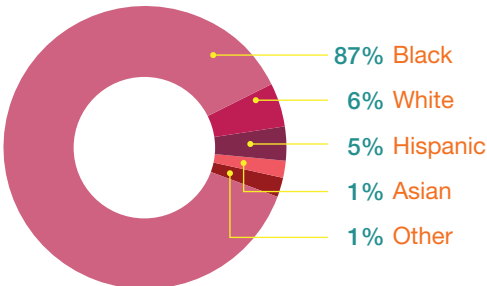

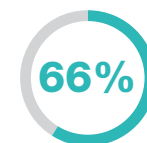

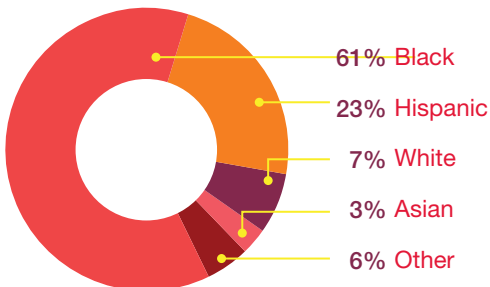
