- 1) Approve Jan 12, 2016 meeting summary: (The minutes were approved.)
- 2) IGNITE.7 "Academically Adrift"
  - Geoff presented an overview Academically Adrift: Limited Learning on College Campuses (2011)
    - Book marks shift from HigherEd focus on retention and experience as indicators of learning
    - o Study uses College Learning Assessment (based on performance tasks) + pre-college data
    - Conclusion: undergrads are not learning enough: "nothing compares to time on task"
    - Highly influential book. Could inform GenEd Assessment cycle (next year: Critical Thinking and Inquiry & Analysis), explains Program Outcomes movement, etc.
  - Discussion: institutional types, innovative methodology, length of courses vs. rigor

## 3) Assessment Committee -- plans & possibilities

- stipends for positions and adjunct involvement? Need job descriptions for committee work
  - Would be payment for attending attached to duties in the description
  - The question of release time was brought up, but has not yet been offered to the Committee (beyond 6 hrs for chair).

#### 4) Program-Level Outcomes

- GenEd Outcomes Jan. Faculty workshop (feedback, notes)
  - It was proposed that March would be a working meeting to go through the notes from the PLO Faculty Workshop in order to work toward finalizing them, particularly with the input from the Math and Science Departments
- Framework for all-college Degree outcomes, and Dept-specific AAS & Credential outcomes?
  - A list of degrees was presented, with the task of creating several outcomes for each credential (including Basic & Advanced Certs.). This list will be emailed to the Committee
  - 836 Basic Certificates were awarded in FY2014/2015, primarily in Nursing, Child Development, and Pharmacy Tech
- The PLO initiative: ensuring academic quality by making sure courses are aligned and integrated for specific achievement goals

### 5) GenEd - Study of Oral Communication - Spring 2016

- Discuss all-faculty survey responses, plan logistics, parameters of study
  - $\circ~$  108 responses (Representative of TR) Only 37% of the respondents don't do presentations.
  - Are we looking at classes (several selections from the same class/instructor).
  - Are we looking at different presentations throughout a discipline/department?
  - How do we avoid selection bias?

Task: - Make a letter that will go out to faculty and ask for video cameras. (Geoff)

## 6) Unit/Discipline Assessment Reports

- Discussion, Template, plans for March
  - The template was presented for each department to use in documenting assessment in their departments (regarding demographic breakdown of a course, for instance), specifically used in data analysis and presenting conclusions of a research question
  - The template is meant to be a flexible tool that each dept. can adjust to fit their needs
  - These 2-3 slide presentations would then be compiled into a 20-25 slide presentation demonstrating assessment practices across the academic departments
  - This would be an annual piece
  - Departments can and should use a departmental problem as a jumping off point for a research question (e.g. more sections of a particular course? at particular times?)
