Session Title: Powershots and Ignite Presentations

Abstract: This session will explain how the implementation and use of Powershots and Ignite Presentation can be beneficial in any institution. These mini presentation formats have been successfully used to assess, support, and inform students, faculty and staff at our institution.

Will also reach out to Diego to see if he would be interested in being part of the presentation for Ignite portion.

Note from Ana re powershot history: "Powershots" came about in the mid 2000s when the Writing Center was established (Dr. Liu will know the exact date, as she was the first faculty director of it). Comm Dept faculty who teach writing recognized that there were "bottlenecks" - - items in the curriculum where significant numbers of students were struggling with the same area, and we felt that this could be handled effectively via conducting short sessions (no more

than an hour), where students could drop in, without needing an appointment. The idea was that these sessions would have about 5-10 students in them.
