Complete Placement	All new students are required to complete placement tests in the areas of English and math. Since the results of your placement test(s) will determine which courses you are eligible to register for, you are encouraged to take the placement test(s) as soon as possible. Do your very best! Your math placement test can be completed in your student portal by clicking the "Academic Records" tile and selecting "Placement Testing." You must take the English placement test in-person in the Testing Center Mon-Thursday or Virtually (from home or any computer lab) on Fridays.					
	The Harold Washington College Testing Center is located on the 4th floor, room 402. When completing your placement tests, please enter your CCC student ID number. Entering a non-CCC ID number will result in scoring delays.					
	Hours of admittance for Placement Testing are Monday, Tuesday, Thursday: 9am -1pm & Wednesday 9am - 11am. On Fridays virtually from 9am – 11am you may submit testing inquires to the Testing Center remotely via the Virtual Student Services Zoom help rooms.
