Harold Washington College Assessment Program Administration: The Assessment Committee



Definition:

The Assessment Committee is a joint student, faculty, and administration standing committee of the Faculty Council.

Directive [12-10-03]:

The Harold Washington Assessment Committee is committed to maintaining a campus culture focused on learning in which faculty, students, and the administration share a common understanding of the meaning, purpose and utility of assessment. It recognizes that for the faculty to be successful in this endeavor there must be meaningful input from students and strong support from the Administration. HWC characterizes "assessment of students learning" as a comprehensive process that is ongoing, systematic, structured and sustainable.

To be effective, the assessment process involves:

- 1. Establishing faculty expectations for student learning and attainment that are explicitly and publicly stated and that set standards for the quality of the learning experience as well as its outcomes.
- 2. Aligning assessment activities, methods, and instruments with the learning outcomes expected by the faculty.
- 3. Gathering, analyzing, and interpreting evidence of student development and attainment to determine how well their performance aligns with faculty's stated expectations and standards.
- 4. Using assessment information from both direct and indirect measures:
 - a. To examine assumptions about learning
 - b. To understand how, when, and where learning takes place
 - c. To identify in what areas and for which students learning needs to be improved
 - d. To encourage efforts to make changes in modes of instruction, program curricula, learning resources, and support services designed to improve student learning
 - e. To create and sustain an institutional culture in which it is the College's priority to assure and improve the quality of education each academic program promises and offers.

The membership of the Assessment Committee shall be as follows:

- One faculty member as Committee Chair and one faculty member as Vice-Chairperson (Approved 9/17/03).
- At least one and not more than two full-time faculty members from each department appointed by the department Chairperson (Approved 9/17/03).
- Each department is represented by two votes, one per appointed member [12-03-03]
- One representative from the office of Student Affairs (Approved 9/17/03).
- One representative from the Center for Distance Learning (CDL) as ex officio chosen by the Dean of CDL (Approved 9/17/03).
- One student member with voting power, who has at least a 2.5 GPA, is recommended by the Student Government Association, and approved by the Dean of Student Services (Approved 9/17/03).
- Vice President Academic and Student Affairs, serving as *ex officio* (pending).
- One member of the faculty council appointed by the Faculty Council [12-03-03]
- Appointment for membership of the Assessment Committee will be complete by Week Three of the Fall semester [12-03-03]

Assessment Committee's Relationship to Harold Washington College Faculty Council

- The Assessment Committee is a standing committee of the Faculty Council. As such, the Faculty Council will maintain oversight and approval of Assessment Committee policy [12-03-03].
- The Assessment Committee shall have one Faculty Council representative who shall be appointed by the council [12-03-03]. The primary role of the Faculty Council's presence on the Assessment Committee is to ensure, through feedback, that the two bodies are mutually informed of the accomplishments and concerns of the faculty relative to designing, collecting, analyzing and revising measurable approaches to learning within and across the academic disciplines. In addition, the Faculty Council and the Assessment Committee can monitor the general effect of assessment on the academic and social culture of the college.

Assessment Committee's Relationship to Academic Departments

 As part of its mission, the Assessment Committee will define assessment and disseminate information on current trends in assessment. The

Oversee the publication of an Annual Report describing the year's outcomes of the assessment of student academic achievement including indications, if any, of improvements in student learning following changes made in curriculum, modes of instruction, library holdings, etc. The report will be made a public document of the college.

Oversee the development, distribution and monitoring of a schedule pertaining to assessment (i.e., as assessment calendar), listing the specific dates on or by which

- 1. assessment instruments will be evaluated
- 2. data and analysis will be submitted to the Committee
- 3. the Committee will meet to review these data and analyses, and
- 4. the Committee's report summary, commentary, and recommendations will be submitted to the Faculty Council and to the CAO.

- Ensure that the assessment procedures and practices adopted by the Assessment Committee, faculty, and administration are professionally sound and meet the needs of the College;
- Disseminate information regarding the field of Assessment and the corresponding assessment activities at HWC to the Harold Washington College Community including but not limited to faculty, administration, staff, and students;
- Provide a forum for dialogue, among academic units, faculty, administration, students and staff to discuss assessment for the purpose of improving student learning;
- Compile assessment results (numerical data and narrative analysis) from the institutional research office and from the academic units;
- Compile and analyze assessment results received from academic units;
- Summarize and interpret results in a written public annual progress report to the entire faculty, CAO and President at the end of each semester or year;
- Identify, prioritize, and recommend resources needed for the coming year to maintain or improve the academic assessment program at the institutional as well as departmental level;
- Make recommendations to the CAO for additional assessment processes and modifications in present practices and/or process;

- Make recommendations to the CAO and the HWCFC for modifications in the assessment process and calendar;
- Make recommendations to the CAO for integrating assessment and evaluation into the planning and budgeting calendar and processes at each level (college, academic unit, department).
- Train department faculty in the selection and use of instruments and measures appropriate to the kinds of learning they want to measure;
- Assist departments in planning and implementing activities to assess student learning across multiple sections of the same course;
- Assist the Cross-Disciplinary learning groups;
- Assist in the work involved in collecting and analyzing assessment data/information before quantitative and narrative results can be distributed and used by faculty.
