Building Façade Update

• Signage for the front of the building is delayed due to re-design issues. However, the final product was approved today, so fabrication and installation are coming soon. Please be advised that on installation day we will direct egress traffic to the Wabash door (more to come soon). The remaining building signage for the upper Lake Street side and the Wabash Street side is expected in February.

High Voltage Signage

■ We have attached signage to the windows where the anti-bird wires are installed (on the outside of the window). Please be assured there is no danger of shock from the window or window trim on the building's inside. The warning is meant for window washers and is required by law. The signage is on the Southwest side of the building -2^{nd} floor up to the 11^{th} floor and the South side of the building -2^{nd} floor up to the 7^{th} floor.

State/Lake CTA Train Station Project - Utility Work Update

- Telecoms will start work on State St in early March, and work will continue onto Lake Street thereafter. Telecom work will last 6-8 weeks.
- ComEd work on Lake Street, Wabash Ave, and State Street will start sometime in March; the exact schedule is still being determined.

Lane Closure Impacts

 During construction of utility relocations, at least 1 lane will remain open on Lake Street and Wabash Ave and 1 lane in each direction on State Street.

Work Hours

■ Telecoms will be working during the daytime and CenTrio will be working at night. ComEd will work daytime hours, and it is not yet known if work will occur at night. Daytime hours are 9-4 M-F, and 8-8 Sat. Utility companies are aware of and required to abide by the Chicago noise ordinance, which limits noisy work during overnight hours.
